As a new member of PSPP, it's important to complete the following tasks within your first year of becoming a PSPP member.

1. Registering for Your Pension Profile

You can sign up for Your Pension Profile (YPP) two weeks after receiving your first pay or any time after you receive your Welcome Package from the Plan. After setting up YPP, it's important to share some personal information about you. Tell us about the important people in your life, and ensure that your contact information is correct.

2. The People in Your Life
